



Markus Petsche is a Professor at the Department of Legal Studies at Central European University, where he teaches International Commercial Arbitration, International Investment Law, and Mediation. He has published two books and numerous journal and law review articles on relevant topics. His work has been cited extensively in legal scholarship and has also been relied upon by the Supreme Court of Oregon, as well as in litigation before the US Supreme Court. Before embarking on an academic career, Markus Petsche served as deputy counsel at the Secretariat of the International Court of Arbitration of the International Chamber of Commerce and practiced international commercial and investment arbitration with Gide Loyrette Nouel (both in Paris). He regularly serves as an expert, arbitrator, and mediator in international business disputes. He holds law degrees from the University of Paris I Panthéon-Sorbonne (maîtrise, DEA), New York University School of Law (LL.M.), and the European University Institute (Ph.D.).
